Homecoming - SHS Celebrates 100 Years

The Silverton High School Alumni Association was invited to participate in several activities for Homecoming this year.

A 1963 boy's letterman sweater, 1960 girl's letterman sweater, cheerleading outfits from 1973 and 1961 were among many items on display in the glass case in the main hall at SHS. There were also Fox's Howl newsletters from the 1950's and several annuals, pom-poms and other memorabilia on display throughout the week.

Dear Fellow Silverton High School Alumni:

The purpose of this letter is to acquaint or reacquaint you with the wonderful scholarship program our Alumni Association has for the graduating seniors who are furthering their education.

We have a capital fund built up from the \$500 lifetime memberships, the yearly \$5 dues, funds donated outright, bequeath from estate, in honor of or memory of someone, plus money earned from special projects. We use only 5% of the interest from the invested capital for scholarships. The \$5 dues also provide working money for the newsletter, etc. Life membership can be accumulative over several years.

One project is our big silent auction held at the Garden Party for Alumni and Friends at the Oregon Garden. This year we made over \$7800 from the auction itself and cash donations. The all class Garden Party is held each year the evening of the first Friday in August. This is a catered dinner with lots of visiting alumni from all classes. (Must be age 21 to attend.)

The newsletter has a host of information about reunions, special people with an exceptional achievement, meeting dates and future plans. We also publish a list "In Memoriam" to honor our alumni who have passed away. The newsletter is published twice a year in June and November.

Our goal is to have some scholarship money for each applicant to attend an accredited college or trade school in the USA. Each spring the application forms are circulated at the high school. We are trying to make it known this is for all graduates - even several years after they have graduated. Every applicant has the same papers to fill out, sign, and return to us to be reviewed by a committee, then fed into a computer to finalize. Maybe some of you or your family members have even received one of the scholarships.

This year the Alumni Association gave \$13,900. Every applicant received a scholarship this year. Since inception in 1996, SHSAA has awarded \$53,800 in scholarships.

I hope there are a lot of you who have used your knowledge, hard work, and "smarts" gained at SHS or SUHS to have a successful career be it professional, a trade, medical, lawyer, teacher, business, or service so you can help us further this project. Your donation is tax deductible and used very wisely.

Each year we honor a special non-grad Silverton citizen of the community with an Honorary Graduation (cap, gown, diploma, ... the works) and take part in the Homer Davenport Days (parade floats, booth in the park, etc.). This year we took an active part in the Homecoming activities at the school during October. We had memorabilia items in a display case in the main hall and a float in the parade. At the football game, the SHS Foxes beat Woodburn Bulldogs 60 to 9!!

We look forward to many of you in joining us and becoming a paid member of the SHS Alumni Association. All meetings are held the 3rd Tuesday of the month at Silverton Realty, 303 Oak St., Silverton. Our annual meeting is held in January to elect officers and new board members and is open to all paid alumni.

Let's have a lot of Lifetime Memberships and donations, big or small, to help out!

Foothills Medical Supply owner Joe Morrison has been associated with the medical community in Silverton for over 20 years. In 1991 he opened his medical supply business which offers a large variety of durable medical equipment to his customers in the east Willamette Valley area. When you walk by the store on North First Street, you only get a small glimpse of what is offered within.

In both 2006 and 2007 the Alumni Association Auction and Scholarship Fund were the recipients of brand new outdoor mobility scooters from Foothills. The scooters were auctioned at the SHS Alumni and Friends Party at the Garden in August, and the proceeds went directly into the fund that provides scholarships for graduating SHS seniors.

On a sunny afternoon in July, we spoke with Mr. Morrison in his store.

Foothills Medical Supply was started in Silverton with the goal of providing high quality medical equipment and excellent service to folks in the Silverton, Salem, Albany, Detroit and south of the Portland area. The store stocks hospital beds, wheelchairs, walkers, canes, lovely recliner/lift chairs, and all oxygen equipment and supplies including C-PAC. Also available are orthotic soft goods, compression stockings, a huge selection of canes, blood pressure cuffs and stethoscopes. If Joe does not stock it or cannot order it for you, he can put you in touch with someone who can.

The people who work at Foothills truly care about their customers and about providing good service. If you step in the door — even if you don’t need something today — you will know what we mean. Many of the store’s referrals are made by doctors. And a large majority of the cost can be covered by insurance or Medicare. But it is a retail store also. If you or a loved one is in need of medical supplies or equipment to make their daily living easier, Foothills probably stocks it.

Joe’s support of Silverton High School and the Alumni Association comes in part from the fact that his three kids attended Silverton schools. “The teachers and the staff in our schools are exceptional. They give their all for the students. A Silverton High School education makes for a great start in life.”

As Alumni of SHS (SUHS) we have to agree. And it is the support of the community, the availability of financial assistance for post high school study and the support of SHS Alumni and Friends that make Silverton a unique place to live.

DON'T take your spouse if you're susceptible to the mood of the moment. Steeped in recollections of the carefree and reckless attitudes of her youth, a former editor and her husband came away from a 20-year class reunion weekend with more than memories; nine months later their third child was born.

DO indulge yourself in recollection. Pack yearbooks and scrapbooks if you're driving to the reunion. If there's going to be an informal get-together like a picnic, take the books along to share with others who will appreciate being reminded of common memories. It's not suggested that you drag the books to a formal dinner dance.

DON'T take your entire library of family albums and vacation pictures spanning the past 20 years. But **DO** take along a few pictures of your kids (and, of course, grandkids and great-grandkids). Old friends are really happy to see them, just as you'd like to see a **few** of their pictures.

DO remember that when people exclaim, "You haven't changed a bit," they're only dealing with externals. No doubt about it: you have changed and likely for the better. A reunion will return you to scenes of your adolescence, when you worried about wardrobe, hair and complexion. By the 20th reunion you'll still be wondering about hair (where it's going), and your complexion (where the lines are coming from). No matter which reunion it is, you should use the opportunity to reflect upon where you've been, how far you've come ... and, of course, where you're going.

DON'T fail to consider the more important questions that will inevitably be posed, particularly near the end of the evening when everyone is suitably loosened up and nostalgic to "get down to brass tacks." Someone asked a friend, "What have you learned?" Her reflection was that "Bad things happen to good people, but we have an amazing capacity to survive."

DO make a real effort to express your thanks to those who organized the reunion. Who knows? Enough appreciation and flattery may make them overlook the headaches of planning the event and they may volunteer to organize the next one.

How Can I be a Class Representative?

We are often asked about the list of Class Reps in the back of the newsletter. "What do I have to do?" is the most common question.

Relax - there are no "duties". A Class Representative is mainly a contact person for a designated class year.

We would presume that person would be keeping track of classmates in order to make preparations for a reunion at 5, 10 or 20 years. The more often you have a reunion, the easier it is to keep track of everyone.

It's a great help when the Class Rep is notified by anyone who moves or changes his/her name. And some classes have better luck than others.

In addition to editing the newsletter, I also keep the Alumni Database up to date. The Class Reps help by sending me the changes of address for their classmates. This is a constant job. I am always receiving Emails with address changes.

Most reunions are held after a 5-year period (5, 10, 15, 20, etc.). Each year we concentrate on whatever year ends in a 5-year period from the date of graduation. For instance for 2007, we mailed complimentary copies of the newsletter to all classes ending in 7 or 2. Check the list of reunions on page 2 and you'll see how many are being held next summer.

In June we'll be sending complimentary copies to the classes ending in 3 and 8. So let this be a "heads up" to you. Start working on your mailing list now. We suggest you begin with a list from the Alumni Assoc. Request a class

roster, compare it with what information you currently have, and work from there. The Post Office does not forward our newsletters. If one is sent out with a bad address (i.e., for one who has moved), the newsletter is returned to us at a cost of 70¢. If the move has been within the past six months, the Post Office will provide us with a current address. Many times, however, we pay for the return only to get it stamped with "Moved - No Forwarding Address" or "FOE" (forwarding order expired).

So let's work together. Contact me for a Class Roster. Let me help you get a head start on your reunion for next year. If you'd like to check our list, just send an Email to: Nunnjk@comcast.net. Be sure to put your **class year in the subject line**.



Change of Address??

These newsletters are sent bulk mail to keep postage costs to a minimum. If one is returned as undeliverable, it costs us an additional 70¢. Most of those returned as postage due are because you have "moved, left no address" or marked "forwarding time expired" or "Undeliverable as addressed - unable to forward".

If you live in an apartment complex or RV park, the address is incomplete without the apartment or unit number. The Post Office will return it to us and charge us the 70¢. In addition, if there is a new address, the Post Office still returns it to us, charges the 70¢ and gives us the new address. If you are a paid member, we will re-send the newsletter for an additional 70¢ postage cost. But that increases the

total cost to \$1.40 for each return that we re-send. With too many returns, that can really cut into the dues amount that would add to the scholarship fund. None of the returned complimentary copies are sent a second time. With the exception of the returned postage costs, this more than covers the newsletter cost and leaves "some" for scholarships. Let's help our graduating seniors further their education.
