Family History

Benjamin and Edith Spaulding Descendants are a large and proud family with roots in eastern North Carolina. Benjamin Spaulding was born in 1773 in Duplin County, North Carolina. He married Edith Delphi Jacobs around the turn of the century and to this union was born nine boys and one girl. The Spaulding Descendants married men and women with the last names of Mitchell, Freeman, Jacobs, Webb, Blanks, Campbell, Graham, Shaw, Newell, Young, Moore, White, and Smith. In, 1850 the Spaulding Descendants built a log church later named Rehobeth AME Zion Church on two acres of land donated by Henry Spaulding, one of Benjamin Spaulding's sons. The log church served as both the site of year-round church services and the school during the winter months.

Benjamin and Edith Spaulding's descendants have achieved acclaim in all walks of life. Spaulding descendants were driving forces in the founding and success of the North Carolina Mutual Life Insurance Company. They have become renowned educators, skilled professionals, acclaimed performers, talented business men and women, and successful farmers.

Most importantly, the Spaulding descendants have retained our sense of pride and community. We are quick to support one another as cousins and friends in all our endeavors. Just as our ancestors recognized, we also understand the importance that family unity holds in all our lives.

What is Genealogy?

Genealogy is the study and tracing of family pedigrees. This involves the collection of the names of relatives, both living and deceased, and establishing the relationships among them based on primary, secondary and/or circumstantial evidence or documentation, thus building up a cohesive family tree. Genealogy is often also referred to as family history, although these terms may be used distinctly: the former being the basic study of who is related to whom; the latter involving more "fleshing out" of the lives and personal histories of the individuals involved.

In its original form, genealogy was mainly concerned with the ancestry of rulers and nobles, often arguing or demonstrating the legitimacy of claims to wealth and power. The term often overlapped with heraldry, in which the ancestry of royalty was reflected in the quarterings of their coat of arms. Many of the claimed ancestries are considered by modern scholars to be fabrications, especially the claims of king and emperors who trace their ancestry to gods or the founders of their civilization. For example, the Anglo-Saxon chroniclers traced the ancestry of several English kings back to god Woden. If these descents were true, Queen Elizabeth II would be a descendant of Woden, via the kings of Wessex.

In fiction, it is common to give a character a complicated fictional genealogy to make his or her background more interesting.

What is the role of a genealogist?

Genealogists collect oral histories and preserve family stories to discover ancestors and living relatives. Genealogists also attempt to understand not just where and when people lived but also their lifestyle, biography, and motivations. This often requires-- or lead to—knowledge of antique law, old political boundaries, immigration trends, and historical social conditions.

The Benjamin and Edith Spaulding Descendants have had several genealogists since the earlier 1800's. But it must be stated that John Andrew Spaulding was one of the greatest genealogists in the Spaulding Family. With the publication of his book in 1989 "A story of the Descendants of Benjamin Spaulding (1773-1862), we the Spaulding descendants are forever indebted to him for keeping the rich Spaulding Ancestry alive.

Presently, Milton Campbell who is a descendant of Benjamin and Edith Spaulding is working with Duke University to expand the rich ancestry of the Spaulding family.

I am honored to announce to the Descendants of Benjamin and Edith Spaulding that the North Carolina Region Committee along with Duke University Medical Center and also with the participation of all of the Descendants of Benjamin and Edith Spaulding that the staff at Duke University has successfully completed a 4000 name pedigree.

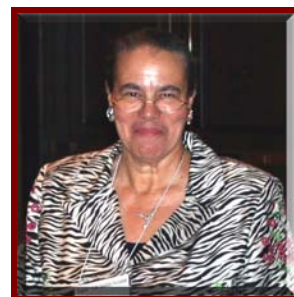

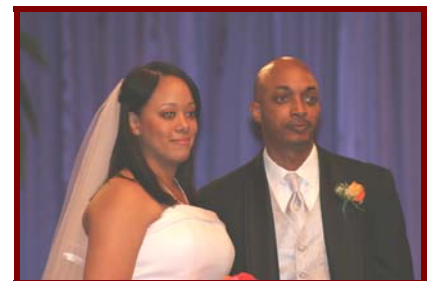
Congratulations Ethan!!!
